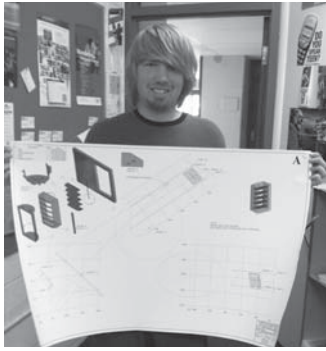

Credential Exchange for Student Safety

Warren Woods Public Schools is always working towards making our buildings safer for your children. A best practice, which has been adopted by the school district's crisis team, is visitor credential exchange.

Beginning shortly, you will notice the following changes:

- People who visit our buildings during normal school hours will be required to turn in a photo ID to the front office receptionist in exchange for a brightly colored visitor badge and lanyard.
- When the visitors are ready to leave the building, they will get their photo ID back.

This improves safety by ensuring that all guests are easily identifiable with a colorful badge in lieu of visitor stickers which are typically hard to read and readily fall off. Additionally, the front office staff will have all of the pertinent information for anyone who is visiting and will be able to visually verify their identity. Working together with our community using the credential exchange program will help keep Warren Woods Public Schools a safe learning environment.

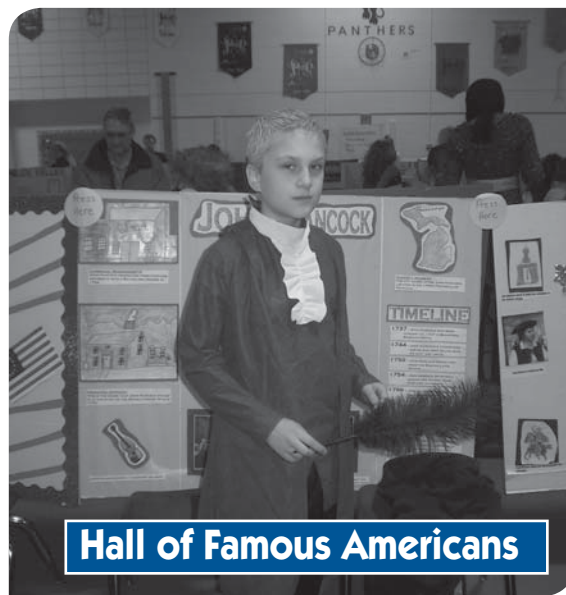
A Fifth Grade Approach

How do we get students to pay attention in a world where holding a child's interest and motivation is not as it has always been?

In the fifth grade, our belief is that we follow the common core but work in a cross-curricular way using hands-on approaches where possible. Throughout the school year, students experience work in cross-curricular projects using a hands-on approach and below we will highlight some examples.

Since Pinewood is a very Green school, we find ways to tie in Science to these efforts. The Invention Convention is a project and exhibit put together by students to assist them in understanding how the process of inventing a new product from existing reused items occurs. Using their inquiry processes, students develop a new product using their creative abilities along with knowledge of how things work. The more students understand about how things work, the history of their area of interest, and are alert of their surroundings, the better chance they have of thinking up and developing solutions to problems that lead to inventions while caring for our Earth. With this convention, students support their scientific inquiry thinking by composing a persuasive essay as well, tying into our writing workshop.

Another project that students use scientific thinking in is the creation and development of recycled "wearable" items. The name of this culminating event is the "Trashion" Show where students display their final products on a runway in a transformed gym filled with observing families. One person's trash can be someone else's treasure and this project guides students in internalizing the overflow of landfills and finding solutions to this problem in their own small yet important way.

Let us not forget about history! Our Hall of Famous Americans is a wax museum where students study, analyze and portray a character in first-person. During participation, they used their research skills to get into the mind of the historical figure and act the character out in a personal way during a time when families and other students visit and learn from them. The students actually get to teach, how cool is that? After all, didn't Confucius himself say "I hear and I forget. I see and I remember. I do and I understand"?

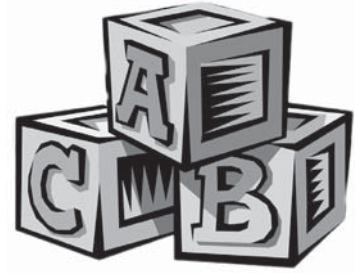
